


Overview

- Implemented in five pilot counties on October 1st, 2014
- Implemented statewide as of October 1st, 2018
- 22 exclusionary criteria are applied to hotline intakes
- Eight RED Team criteria are a supplemental set of criteria applied to intakes
- Of all intakes determined eligible for AR, 50% are randomized to AR and 50% are randomized to TR




3,823 intakes out of 32,654 were eligible for AR from October 1st, 2014 through August 30th, 2018

Programmatic Successes

- 1. Safety is NOT compromised; Children in AR are as safe as children in Traditional Response
- 2. AR has the capacity to achieve the intended goals of enhancing child and family wellbeing
- 3. Families have access to timely services
- 4. Community response initiatives

- 1. Limited number of families eligible for AR
- 2. Align with Family First Prevention Services Act



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
